

#### **Narali Purnima**

Narali Pournima or Coconut Day is a ceremonial day observed by Hindu fishing communities in Maharashtra particularly around Mumbai and the Konkan coast. It is held on the full-moon day of the Hindu month of Shravan which falls around July or August. The ocean was worshipped with rice, flowers and coconuts as offerings. Another ceremony involves women tying a rakhi or amulet on the wrists of their brothers.





Significance and celebration:

This festival is also referred to as Shravan Purnima as it falls in the month of Shravan. Down south, this day is observed as Avani Avittam. Whereas the prominent states of North India like Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh will celebrate Kajri Purnima.

During Narali Purnima, the devotees, meaning the Kolis and other fishing communities in the coastal regions, worship Lord Varuna, Varuna, who is hailed as the God of oceans and seas. The devotees pray to Lord Varuna offering him coconut and thank him for nurturing them and giving them a livelihood. After performing the puja, the fishermen sail in the sea with their decorated boats. Along with their families, they soak in the festivities with zest and fervor. They sing, dance, eat and distribute special sweets made of coconut. The importance of coconut: The word Narali Purnima is made of two words, Naral – which means coconut and Purnima – which signifies the full moon; hence the coconut holds an essential significance in festivities and rituals of Narali Purnima.

#### **Coconut Tree- Tree of Life:**

The Coconut Tree (scientific name: Cocos Nucifera) is called the "Tree of Life" because all the parts of the entire tree--from top to bottom--are used to sustain human life.

- The outer layer is called the husk, which is a hard, fibrous layer; it is the source of coir which is used to make commercial products like brushes, carpets, clothes, doormats, fertilizer, fishnets, fuel, hollow blocks, insulators, mattresses, mats, ornaments, ropes, plastic boards, wall boards, yarn, etc.
- · The second layer under the husk is the shell which covers the meat inside; the shell can be burned to make fuel or charcoal, or used to make bags, baskets, cups, frames, jewelry, lamps, ornaments, pots, purses, serving dishes, trays, etc
- · Inside the shell, the core of the coconut, are the meat and coconut water (or coconut juice). The meat is grated and squeezed to produce coconut milk, which is used in cooking a whole gamut of dishes, from appetizers to main courses and desserts;
- The water from the young coconut makes a refreshing drink when chilled, and is said to help balance the electrolytes in the body.
- The leaves of the coconut tree are woven into roofs and walls; they are also used in cooking to wrap food and rice cakes, and in handicraft to make bags, balls, fans, hats, etc.
- The roots are made into rope or twine, and can be used for making beverages, dyes, medicines, etc.

#### **ASSERTIVE NATIONALISM IN INDIA**

#### **Methods of Assertive Nationalism:**

- 1. Swadeshi Movement: Swadesh movement reiterated on the use of the goods produced in the country which had been an epitome of the regional culture. The nationalists organised bonfires of foreign cloth, salt and sugar. They additionally picketed the shops selling imported British goods. They promote setting up shops solely dedicated to Indian goods.
- 2. Boycott Movement: The boycott movement emphasised a ban on British goods and products as it would promote the growth and development of local Indian industries. The large scale flourishment would in turn create employment opportunities for the local skilled workforce in the region.
- 3. National Education: They planned the introduction of National Education in India by means of setting up educational infrastructure of schools, colleges and universities. These educational programs were not controlled by the British government, it in turn propelled Indians to learn about their rights and fight against the British.
- 4. Passive Resistance: They promoted the passive resistance ideology which involved adopting a non-violent methodology to necessitate the achievement of Swaraj or complete freedom from the British imperial rule.
- 5. Attitude Against the British: They had no faith in the British rule and criticised the British for the deteriorated economic state of the country. They favoured policies of vigorous and direct action in order to breaking the hold of the British imperialism in the country.
- 6. Newspaper Publication: The newspaper publication were initiated to convey the ideology and the prolonged exploitation of the British while encouraging them to provide active support in the freedom struggle. The Punjab, The Bande Mataram, The People and Young India were the popular newspapers which reached the common people of the country. The writing was solely based on assertive nationalism.



#### Popular Actions and Achievements by the Assertive Nationalists:

- 1. The primary achievement of the assertive nationalists involves extended and expanded social base of the freedom fight through inductment of middle class communities, youth of the country and the women of the society. This created a mass freedom movement in the British ruled India.
- 2. The assertive nationalists were responsible for exposing the hollowness of the British sense of justice and infused the spirit of active and effective nationalism in the country. They layed the foundation for the movements against British for shaping a effective judicial system and responsible government administration.
- 3. The assertive nationalists promoted and inculcated the value of togetherness and national pride among the society. They did not allow eradication of Indian festivals and played a major role in reviving the Ganapathi and Shivaji festivals in the country.
- 4. The assertive nationalists built a nation on the ideology aimed at self-reliance through organising various movements for bringing them to the notice of the people. They ensured large development of Indian industries and employment opportunities to the people of the country.
- 5. They gave a rejuvenated and fresh self-confidence to the Indian society and freedom struggle movement by getting the Partition of Bengal annulled in the year 1911.

The process took pace with respect to each draft resolution version of the original and the amended version by the Young People.


Every delegation participated in a total of 83 votes and we were able to learn about governance, engagement, innovation, leadership & global citizenship.




Many Young People gave their views, interventions and the need of the resolution now.
